



This task has been both informative and important.

So far, we have learned of the overwhelming love that members have for the people and ministries of this church. We hear this through the affirmations for social justice ministry, music programs, growing congregational care, and hospitality. We also hear it in the expressions of concern for better communication from leadership, the desire to see more youth and families and more opportunities for them, the need for more people to accept positions of leadership, and the desire for connection and fellowship.

The Transition Team has much more to do to listen for where God is calling us. We continue to hold Listening Circles and prepare a congregational survey. We also look forward to Rev. Becky David's arrival in a couple of weeks to add her voice to our listening task.
